They are currently working with the Excel rosters and should be returning them to National by April 28. We will be running these rosters in a test area as a parallel study. The pilot states must submit the identical rosters in both paper format and excel format. The paper

rosters will be entered the usual way into our membership system and the excel rosters will be entered in the test area using the new program. Once entered in both systems, the results will be compared. If all works as planned – the results should be identical.

- 2) SLC registration has begun and we already have several returns. Council members were sent the registration form in March.
