Expanding HBCU and PWI Collaborations in AAAE

During this discussion, we will explore the established partnership between the National Conference on Learner Centered Teaching, M.E.N.T.O.R. Collaboration, and North Central AAAE. Individuals engaged in the conversation will reflect on elements essential to fostering collaborations between Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU) and Primarily White Institutions (PWI). In addition, participants will explore possibilities to cultivate additional HBCU and PWI collaborations through AAAE.
